Inga Liukaitytė - Piano

Inga Liukaityte is a Lithuanian pianist and piano teacher based in Northwood. She has won prizes in international piano competitions in Italy, Czech Republic, Romania, Greece, France and Lithuania. Her most recent success was winning 2nd prize at the Norah Sande Award in Eastbourne in July 2018. Inga gave her London debut in 2012 playing a solo recital for the Yamaha Lunchtime series. This was followed by recitals in the South Hill Park Arts Centre in Bracknell, the Brunton Theatre at the Edinburgh Fringe and for Music Nairn.

In March 2013 Inga won first prize in the prestigious Bamber Galloway piano competition at the Conservatoire. In November 2013 she was second at the Beethoven Inter-collegiate Competition in the Austrian Cultural Forum in London. She was then invited by the Beethoven Society to give a solo lunchtime recital at St James's, Piccadilly in January 2014. Inga also appeared in the Piano Festival organized by the City Halls in Glasgow, giving a lunchtime performance at the Royal Concert Hall in November 2014.

As part of her chamber ensemble, Inga performed at the Torroella de Montgri Festival in Spain, the Barbican Hall, and St James's Piccadilly. She regularly gives solo and chamber recitals and has performed at Southwark Cathedral, St James' Waterloo, St James' Paddington, St Pancras Church, St Bride's Fleet Street, St Mary's Perivale, Northwood Synagogue and other venues across the UK. Inga has also delivered interactive performances for children in London and Peterborough. Aside from her performance career, Inga is a keen teacher, her pupils varying from young children to adults.
